The Presbytery is looking for people willing to train to deliver Safeguarding courses to volunteers within our congregations.

We're looking for people who have excellent interpersonal skills, who might have a training background and who are willing to use their skills to deliver training using materials and resources provided by the Safeguarding Office. Training in safeguarding and the use of resources will be given.



Ideally we would like a team of 6 to 8 people to carry out the training in Glasgow, each delivering no more than two training sessions a month. Currently we have 2 trainers plus 2 in training.

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What skills are we looking for in potential trainers?

- Experience in delivering presentations using PowerPoint/video clips
- Experience in facilitating discussion groups
- Experience in facilitating meetings, setting up rooms, basic administration and good organisational skills.
- Able to learn training material to be delivered, become familiar with it and answer questions about it.
- Able to work well as part of a team.
