Busby Faces Huge Challenge

The Church of Scotland's Glasgow Presbytery, propose to unite Busby Parish Church and Greenbank Church in five years time, with a very real threat of Busby's Church closing. After 182 years, Busby will no longer have a Parish Church. This would be a significant loss for the whole of Busby, not just for Church members.

It's true that people are more important than places but it is the buildings and facilities in a village which provide the opportunity for people to come together and play a significant role in the social fabric of a community. The loss of our Parish Church wouldn't just be that of a place of worship, devastating though that would be. It would also mean the loss of an important contribution towards community life and social well-being in Busby, and another step towards it losing its identity as a village. Our Church hosts an ever popular Mother and Toddler Group for all faiths and none, Brownies, Girl Guides, a "Drop-in Club" for local senior citizens and numerous social events such as the annual Pantomime, Christmas Fayre, Summer Garden Party, Burns Supper, Coffee Mornings and Ceilidh, as well as organizing litter-picking to keep our streets and public places clean, providing pastoral care for the vulnerable and those in need in our community and supporting local food banks and care homes, not to mention offering baptisms, weddings and funerals to local people. As well as all these, our halls host a range of local clubs and classes. Losing all of these would be very damaging to the village.

However, our future is in our own hands and, to secure it, we need to make ours a thriving Church with an active congregation of all ages, playing a central role in the community of Busby for everyone. To do this, we will listen to what people want in the village. We will welcome suggestions for community events to add to those we already run. We are currently investigating the possibility of running a Village Fair, similar to the once successful Busby Gala Day. We intend to develop our facilities so that more people can share in more local activities, bringing them closer together. We especially plan to cater for young people who are the future. We want to know how we can help those in need and how to make Busby Parish Church more welcoming on Sundays, and on every other day. Five years from now we intend to be seen as vital and indispensable to Busby, especially by its residents.

We know this isn't going to be easy and, although we are committed to achieving our plan, we need the full support of everyone in the village. We need people to tell us what they want in the community and how their local Church can help to make it happen. We must be prepared to make changes. We also need support for our current events and future ones based on the suggestions of local people. We need people to attend these and not simply donate. It's all about taking part and sharing these occasions, and not just about financial support. In the 2011 census, there were 3,917 people in Busby, of whom 38% gave their religion as Church of Scotland. That's 1,488 people! This is the first time we have distributed Focus door-to-door throughout the Parish of Busby in order to reach as many people as possible. If you are one of the 38%, or if you're not but value all that we can do in the community, it's time to play your part. We have five years and we know we can do it. However, the clock is ticking.
